The first version of Click Go The Shears was titled "The Bare-Belled Ewe" and was published in the Bacchus Marsh Express in 1891. The "pumping" sea shanty "Ring The Bell" is a maritime adaptation of the 1865 song "Ring the Bell Watchman" by Henry Clay Work. This celebrated the Union victory in the American Civil War.
